Welcome to Weekend Camp:

- This program is for Cub, Webelos & AOL Scouts to participate with a parent or with their den or pack. Scouts will experience camp life similar to a BSA resident camp.
- Working in den and patrols, scouts will balance working on the newest electives, having fun enhancing their scout skill and various jobs.
- Scouts will receive a record of all activities they complete.

Sneak Peak: Openings, closings, electives, range and target activities, waterfront, family game time, campfires, friends and more.

Fees:

- \$125 per youth
- \$25 per adult
- \$15 camp T-shirt

Arrival:

- Arrival starts between 6:00 – 8:00PM on Friday evening.
- Check in at the Dingman cabin (right of Paul Bunyan).
- Medical Forms Part A and B are required for each person that will be camping overnight. All forms must be turned in at arrival. Forms can be picked up when you check out.

Camping:

- All scouts and adults will be assigned to a camp site.
- Scouts from the same pack will be assigned together.
- Camp sites may consist of mixed packs.

Adult Supervision:

- Scouts attending camp must be accompanied by a responsible adult while on camp, as our staff is here to provide program and not supervision.
- Scouts attending camp must register with a parent/guardian, OR
- Scouts attending camp register as a member of a den/pack, with adult supervision provided by the unit. A minimum of 2 adults must register with the den/pack up to 10 scouts.

Adult Requirements:

- A parent/guardian bringing their own child doesn't need to be a registered leader, however Youth Protection Training is required. This can be taken at my.scouting.org.
- An adult accompanying a den/pack to camp must be a registered BSA leader.

Meals:

- Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be served in the dining hall.
- Special dietary needs or food allergies can be emailed to kimberly.gifford@scouting.org.
- Do not leave food in your tent.

Tenting:

- Separate tenting arrangements must be provided for male and female adults, as well for male and female youth.
- Youth sharing tents must be no more than 2 years apart in age.
- In cub scouting, parents/guardians may share a tent with their family.
- Spouses may share a tent.

Scout Uniform

- Uniforms are to be worn at dinner and Saturday's camp fire.

Trading Post:

- The trading post is located inside the dining hall. Snacks, drinks, various scouting supplies and merchandise will be available for purchase. Cash or credit cards will be accepted.

Waterfront Program & Swim Test:

- Swim tests will be required for the aquatics part of our weekend.

Health & Medical Forms:

- There will be a Health Officer at Bullowa during the daytime programs.
- Medical Forms Part A and B are required for each person that will be camping overnight. All forms must be turned in at arrival. Forms can be picked up when you check out.

Behavior & Policies:

- At Camp Bullowa, our two main goals are fun and safety. When there are behavior problems, these goals become difficult to meet for all campers. It's important that each participant behave as they pledge in the Scout Oath and Law.
- NO alcohol or drugs.
- NO smoking tobacco/e-cigarettes.
- The Scouting America will not tolerate any form of child abuse in any form; emotional, physical, sexual, or neglect. Parents should be confident that camp is a haven for their children.
- NO hazing, bullying, fighting, threatening others, using profanity, stealing or damaging property of others/camp.
- Only the parents of a child may sleep in the same tent with the child.
- No pets are allowed in camp.
- No personal firearms or archery equipment are allowed.
- The following behaviors are forbidden: bullying, fighting, threatening others, using profanity, stealing or damaging property of others/camp, leaving a program activity without permission, endangering anyone's health or safety, smoking tobacco/e-cigarettes, using alcohol or drugs, sexual conduct, bringing weapons onto camp property.
- Cell phones and other electronic devices are not permitted at camp by campers unless for medical reasons.
